

Dutch Aviation Open Golf 2012

A great and social golf day and this year's winner Kevin Wall



Although it started with some drizzling rain, followed by more water coming down, the weather improved rapidly and made this day an excellent golf tournament again. The golf course looked beautiful and the trees definitely had crown much bigger than last year, at least for some of us. Yet it made the competition very challenging and revealed some new promising players. Every year has its own dynamic for whatever reason and also this year some remarkable things. In average the score was slightly less compared with last year. Also in the top ten we see some "new" faces who can become very promising in the future. This year's winner of the Hans Minnee Challenge Trophy, Kevin Wall has made a remarkable comeback. Being 3rd in 2009 he felled back to 13th position the year thereafter but significantly improved and finally ending at first on the Dutch Aviation Open 2012. Second in line was Ronald van den Bergh.

Although VZM had agreed with him not to win the game again, he played extremely well. His handicap had to be adjusted to make him second – but out of competition. The second prices went to Arian van der Werff and Steven Williams both scoring 31 points.

the clinic during this year's edition. The in the end nice weather, good company and positive reactions are an encouragement of all loyal participants to attend the 15th event next year.


