Record attendance at Dutch Aviation Golf Open 2004

Nunspeet, Sept. 14 -- This year's VZM Dutch Aviation Open Golf Tournament broke a record. For this 6th edition, which was held again at the Nunspeetse Golf & Country Club, a total number of 37 aviation friends participated. Winner of the *Hans Minnee Challenge Trophy* was Ronald van den Bergh.

Despite Monday's weather predictions, Tuesday September 14 was a wonderful day. Only in the last hour of the competition some flights had to cope with a short rain shower. 'The atmosphere was like a reunion with old friends', some participants stated. The 18 holes competition started shortly after noontime. The 22 contesters were all very eager to challenge last year's winner Erik Gerhard. Some of the players had the impression they had played in the woods for some time.

Next year's Aviation Open on September 13th 2005

In the meantime, the remaining 15 participants gathered for the golf clinic. On special request, Donald Armour had been contracted as a pro again. His inspiring way of teaching his students the fundamentals of golf, combined with his Scottish humour and sarcasm, made the day a real joy for those having the privilege of attending his course. Especially useful were the tips & tricks to impress your opponent by swirling the club in your hand, or by the slight arrogance in your attitude after a good stroke were 'very useful'. The clinic course was concluded with a 3 holes team match. After this match, most participants were convinced that still a lot of practicing was needed after all. Leif Samuelsson illustrated that his appetite to do so was still there, stating: 'Maybe I have to start playing more often!' Leif ended up second in the final clinic score, just one point behind

Tournament

Like last year, all participators started off with great enthusiasm. The holes are located splendidly in the woods. This precisely caused the biggest problem for the players. Many of them have visited the bushes regularly, to get the ball into the course again. Hitting the ball in the right direction appeared to be very important, rather than hitting it over a long distance alone. Just this makes golf such fun and difficult at the same time! All the bigger was the achievement by Ronald van den Bergh, who – in spite of his limited golf experience – ended up in first place with 35 Stableford points. In his victory speech Ronald expressed how honored he was to receive the Hans Minnee Challenge Trophy. Tjapko van Wijk, who already won the tournament twice (2000 and 2002), was this year's runner up with 33 points. The third prize was for Michael Donahoe with 31 points.

Hans Minnee Challenge Trophy

As a winner of the 6th Dutch Aviation Open Golf Tournament, Ronald van den Bergh was being awarded the 'Hans Minnee Challenge Trophy'. The sculpture was made by Gary Price and is named after Hans Minnee, cofounder of VZM Management Services, who died unexpectedly in April 2003. Hans was the driving force behind the golf tournament and discovered the sculpture himself, during a business trip to the US.
